State of South Carolina MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATES WORTH COUNTY OF Greenville To All Whom These Presents May Concern: I, Celia Sher, of Greenville County, SEND GREETING: WHEREAS, I the said Celia Sher in and by my certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, in the full and just sum of Ten Thousand and No/100 - - - - - - - - (\$10,000.00) five (5%) Dollars, with interest at the rate of six/60%) per centum per annum, to be repaid in instalments of One Hundred and No/100 - - - - - - - - - - - - - (\$ 100.00) Dollars upon the first has been paid said month. The state of has been paid, said monthly payments shall be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid balance, and then to the payment of principal; said note further providing that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, or failure to comply with any of the By-Laws of said Association, or any of the stipulations of this mortgage, the whole amount due under said note, shall, at the option of the holder thereof, become immediately due and payable, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for ten (10%) per centum attorney's fee beside all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, and to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.
