


Scale of 40 poles per inch



State of South Carolina
 Chester County

I have surveyed and plotted 80 acres of Land for W.P. Davis on waters of Fall Creek, adjoining lands of Mary Coggins, Wm. Wood, James Coggins, J.F. Coggins, John Gordon and others, Beginning at a black oak near a small branch Mary Coggins corner & run $N 61^{\circ} W$, 14 poles to a white oak stump. Then $N 81^{\circ} W$, 27 poles to a map. Then $N 4^{\circ} W$ with Wm. Woods line 58 poles to a rock. Then $N 53^{\circ} W$, 33 poles to a Chestnut oak. Then $N 30^{\circ} E$, 8 poles to a white oak (down) Then $N 61 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$, 50 poles to a dead Chestnut James Coggins corner. Then with his line $S 62 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$, 8 poles to a white oak. Then down with the meanderings of same 97 poles to a rock John Gordon corner. Then with his line $S 56^{\circ} W$, 70 poles to a white oak his corner near a creek. Then about 10 poles to a small map near a road. Then $N 31^{\circ} W$, 2 poles to said road, and with the same 32 poles to Mary Coggins Spring. Then up the branch 23 poles to the beginning.
