During this time, we will continue to provide all of our great services as usual, but with significantly less animal housing and operational space. Due to necessary section closures, more than 50 animals will be directly impacted at a time, which means we must reduce intake while increasing adoptions and fosters to ensure every pet has a safe place!

• Snap a photo & post online – Use Facebook, Nextdoor, PawBoost, and local lost pet pages.

- Text the word FOUND to 864-467-3950 Get helpful tools to reunite a lost pet with their family quickly! • Check for an ID tag – Call the owner if contact info is available.
- Take them to a vet Most can scan for a microchip for free. • Hold onto them if possible – Keeping them nearby helps them reunite with their family faster!
- IF YOU LOST A PET: Act fast! The sooner you start searching, the better your chances.

• Walk the pet around the neighborhood – Someone may recognize them!

- Text the word LOST to 864-467-3950 Get helpful tools to reunite a lost pet with their family quickly!
- Post on social media & lost pet groups Include clear photos, last known location, and contact
- Check with neighbors Knock on doors and ask around! • Visit the shelter and check online – We'll continue reuniting pets with owners throughout the renovation.
- **Keep looking!** Pets often return home within a few days. Together, we can reunite pets with their families faster—without them ever entering the shelter!
