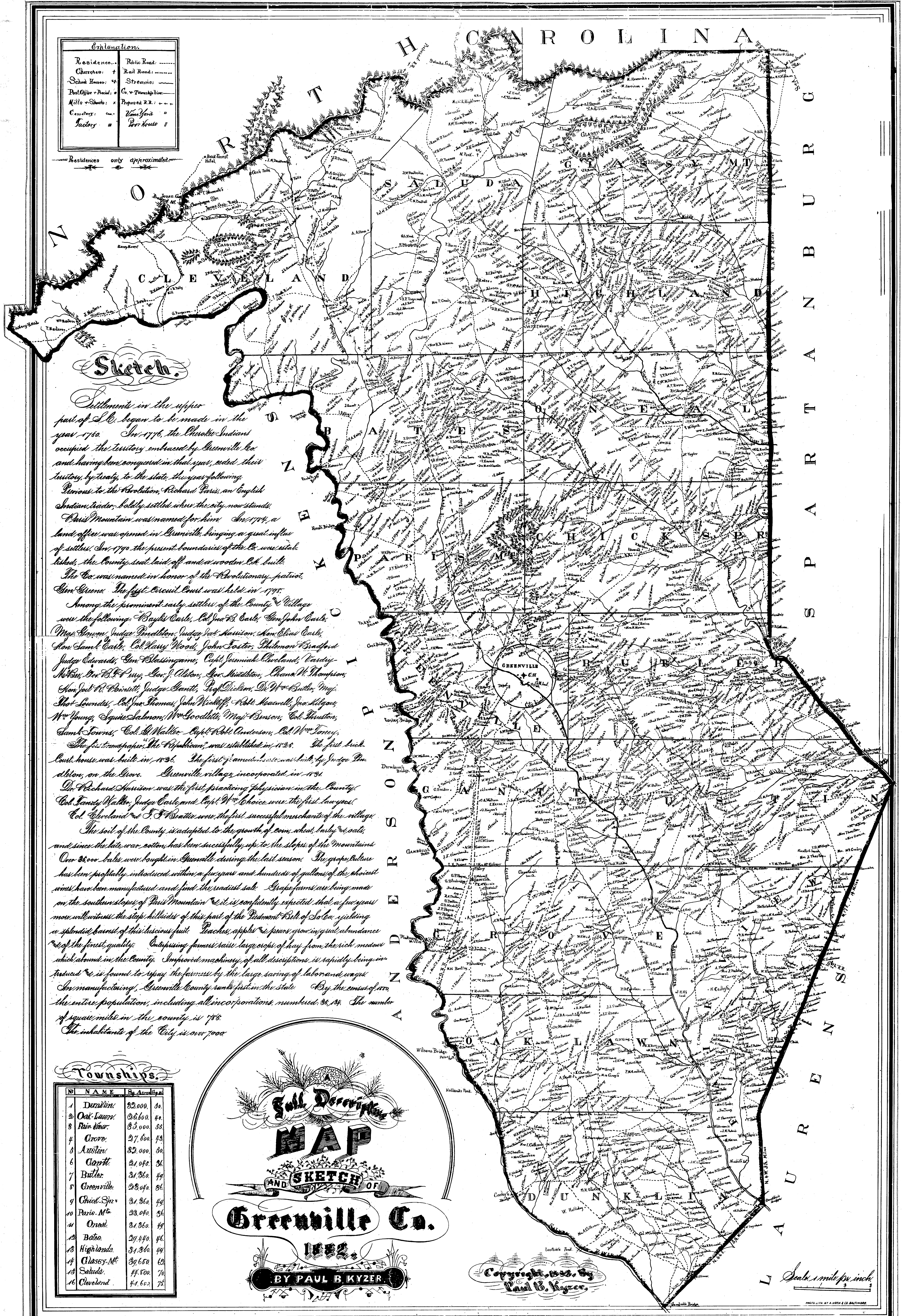

Settlements in the upper part of S.C. began to be made in the year 1750. In 1776, the Cherokee Indians occupied the territory embraced by Greenville Co. and having been conquered in that year, ceded their territory, by treaty, to the state, the year following.

Previous to the Revolution, Richard Paris, an English Indian trader, boldly settled where the city now stands. Paris Mountain was named for him. In 1784, a land office was opened in Greenville, bringing a great influx of settlers. In 1790 the present boundaries of the Co. were established, the County seat laid off and a wooden Ck. built.

The Co. was named in honor of the Revolutionary patriot, Gen. Greene. The first Circuit Court was held in 1798.

Among the prominent early settlers of the County the following: Bayles Carle, Col. Jas. B. Carle, Gen. John Carle, Major General, Judge Partridge, Judge J. H. Harrison, Gen. Elias Carle, Gen. Saml. Carle, Col. Henry Wood, John Foster, Philmont Bradford, Judge Edwards, Gen. Blasingame, Capt. Jeremiah Cleveland, Vandyke, Major, Dr. B. F. Wray, Gov. J. Alden, Gov. Middleton, Chas. W. Thompson, Hon. J. R. Pruitt, Judge Gerritt, Prof. Dickson, Dr. W. G. Butler, Maj. Tho. Leonard, Col. Jas. Thomas, John Wright, Robt. Maxwell, Geo. Kilgore, Wm. Young, Squire Salmon, Wm. Goodlett, Maj. Benson, Col. Shinton, Saml. Towns, Col. W. Walker, Capt. C. Anderson, Col. Wm. Torrey.

The first newspaper, "The Republic", was established in 1836. The first such Court house was built in 1836. The first jail was built, by Judge Partridge, on the Grove. Greenville village, incorporated in 1834.

Dr. Richard Harrison was the first practicing physician in the County. Col. James Walker, Judge Carle and Capt. Wm. Choice were the first lawyers. Col. Cleveland and J. C. Beattie were the first successful merchants of the village.

The soil of the County is adapted to the growth of corn, wheat, barley & oats, and since the late war cotton has been successfully raised on the slopes of the mountains over 8000 bales were brought in Greenville during the last season. The grape culture has been profusely introduced within a few years and hundreds of gallons of the choicest wine have been manufactured and find the readiest sale. Grape farms are being made on the southern slopes of Paris Mountain & it is confidently expected that a few years more will witness the steep hillides of this part of the Piedmont Belt of S.C. yielding a splendid harvest of this luscious fruit. Peaches, apples & pears grow in great abundance and of the finest quality. Catfishing farms raise large crops of hay from the rich meadows which abound in the County. Improved machinery of all descriptions is rapidly being introduced & is found to repay the farmer by the large saving of labor and wages.

In manufacturing, Greenville County ranks first in the state. By the census of 1850, the entire population, including all incorporations, numbered 36,847. The number of square miles in the county is 788.

The inhabitants of the City is over 7000.
