Greenville Men Sentenced on Armed Robbery and Related Charges

Thirteenth Circuit Solicitor Walt Wilkins states that Antonio Courvesier Calloway, age 19, and Daquan Anthony Seymour, age 18, were sentenced on May 14, 2012, after each pled guilty to charges of armed robbery, attempted armed robbery, kidnapping, and attempted murder. The Honorable C. Victor Pyle sentenced Antonio Calloway to 25 years in the South Carolina Department of Corrections and Daquan Seymour to 15 years. Each will have to serve at least 85 % of his sentence before he becomes eligible for parole

Evidence presented at the plea hearing by Assistant Solicitor Mark Moyer established that these two men, along with a 3rd co-defendant, Joseph Cromer, committed three separate armed robberies during the early morning hours of July 25, 2010. The men first robbed 10 high school students at Crossroads Apartments on Cleveland Street in Greenville. They entered the apartment armed with a pistol, forced the victims to crawl on their hands and knees to a back room, and robbed the victims of cell phones and cash. The defendants then robbed two men outside their mobile home on Anderson Road in Greenville. They held the victims at gunpoint and robbed them of cash. Before leaving, Antonio Calloway shot one of the victims in the leg. The defendants then robbed a Citgo convenience store on Piedmont Highway. They held two female clerks at gunpoint and stole money from the cash register. They then made the ladies lie face down on the floor and stole one's pocketbook and the other's car keys. The investigation by the Greenville County

Sheriff's Office and the Greenville Police Department led to the arrest of Mr. Seymour on July 30, 2010, and of Mr. Calloway August 6, 2010.
