Hand Carwash/Detail Shop: A Business Occupancy that washes, cleans, details cars by hand at a specified location. An open sided canopy may be set up at the location providing the following requirements are met:

Tomporary 180 days as defined IRC section 108 and 2103 and IEC Chapter 31

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	Temporary. 100 days as defined IBC section 106 and 3103 and IPC Chapter 31

2.	Proposed length of time unit will be on the site:
3.	Toilet Facilities: Approved toilets are required. Permit sewer connection or provide a service contract for Handicap portable toilets / holding tank services. Service contracts must match unit's duration of use.
4.	Site Plan: An 8-1/2x11 plan showing the location of canopy(s) on the property shall be uploaded at the time of application. The plan shall include dimensions from property lines, R/W, and other existing or proposed structures.

Setbacks: to property lines and Right of Way (R/W). This dimension is required for processing.
