GREENVILLE COUNTY DISASTER GENERATED DEBRIS REMOVAL

In the wake of Hurricane Helene, Greenville County will remove your disaster generated debris from the right of ways from County maintained roads.

FAQs:

WHERE SHOULD I PUT MY DEBRIS FOR PICKUP?

We ask that you please stack hurricane-related debris on the right-of-way, or road shoulder, in front of your home - specifically the area that extends from the street to the sidewalk, ditch, utility pole or easement. Do NOT block the road with the debris.

WHEN WILL MY DEBRIS BE PICKED UP?

This will be a multiple week-long process. We will be making multiple pickups on every county maintained road, on several different days. If you can't get it all out right away please know that we will be returning for additional pickups.

WHAT KIND OF DEBRIS WILL BE PICKED UP?

This pickup is for disaster generated debris (think loose vegetation, trees & limbs) - do NOT put out bags of trash, as it will NOT be collected by our trucks.

HOW LARGE IS THIS EFFORT?

We have 50+ trucks dedicated to this effort - some very large and others smaller and more nimble to help reach more remote areas.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY ROAD IS A COUNTY ROAD?

In Greenville County, multiple agencies and private parties own and maintain roads. Each has its own unique identifying system and organizational structure. On signage, County roads are listed as "A-R" followed by a four-digit number (ex. J0029) You can visit **www.gcgis.org** to search for your road.

WHERE SHOULD I NOT PLACE MY DEBRIS?

Do NOT place debris:

- In the roadway as this obstructs traffic, hinders cleanup and power restoration efforts, and makes it difficult for emergency vehicles to pass.
- In front of a fire hydrant or mailbox
- Under power lines or low hanging limbs
- Near vehicles, fences, drainage ditches, storm drains, transformers, power lines, utility poles or guy wires, and utility meters (*hidden electrical hazards can injure or kill collection personnel.*)
- Take extreme caution when cleaning and removing debris from your property and never let children play on a debris pile.
- On vacant lots or other private property. It will NOT be picked up.

IS THERE A SCHEDULE?

There is no public schedule - we will be making several passes so if you are missed, don't worry we will be back multiple times. Pick up will be ongoing all month.

DOES THIS INCLUDE STREETS WITHIN NEIGHBORHOODS?

Yes. This debris pickup is for all County maintained roads.

HOW DO WE REQUEST OUR STREET?

No request needed! If you are in Greenville County, our crews will be making rounds on every county-maintained street.
